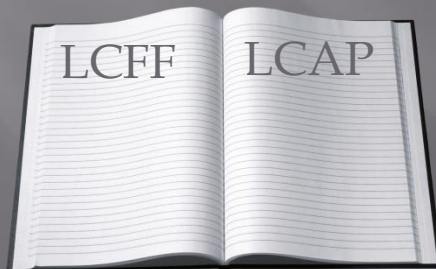

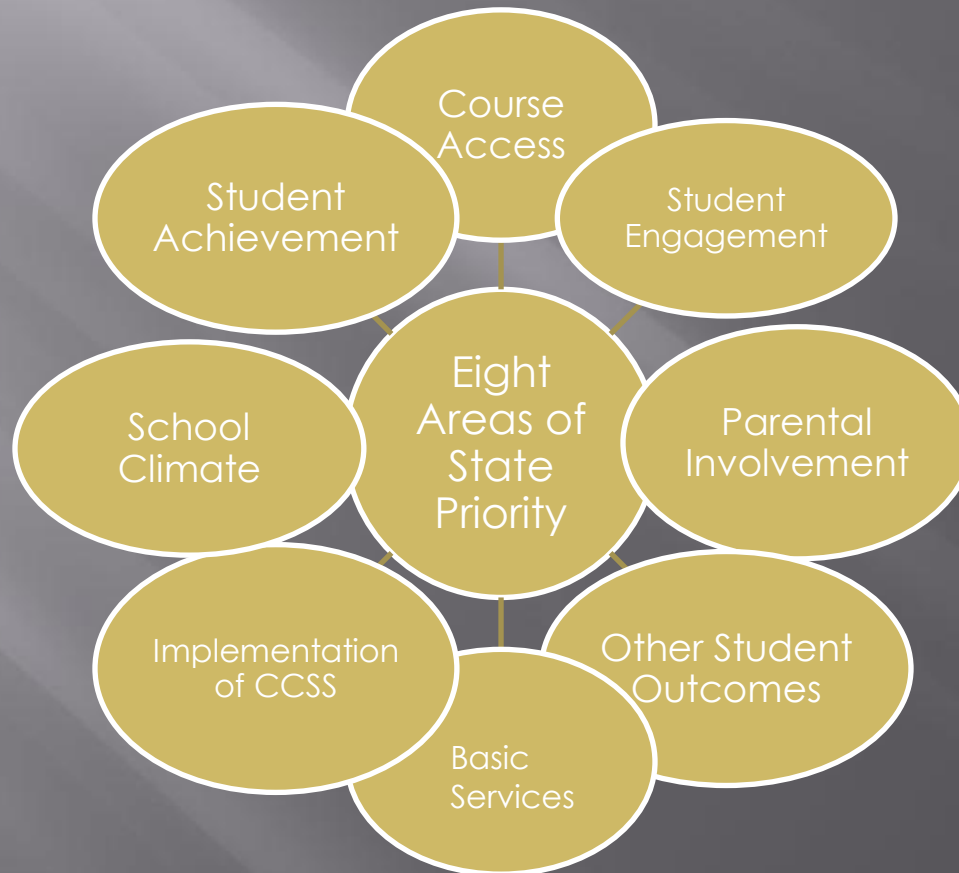
What is the LCAP?

- ▣ The Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) is an important component of the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF).
- ▣ Under the LCFF all school districts are required to prepare an LCAP, which describes how they intend to meet annual goals for all pupils, with specific activities to address state and local priorities identified.



What Needs To Be Included In The LCAP?

AREAS OF STATE PRIORITY



Eight State Priority Areas *

A. Conditions of Learning:

Basic Services

- Rate of teacher misassignments
- Student access to standards-aligned instructional materials
- School facilities in good repair

Implementation of State Standards

- Implementation of academic content and performance standards for all students as adopted by the State Board of Education

Course Access

- Student access to and enrollment in all required areas of study

B. Pupil Outcomes:

Student Achievement

- Standardized test results
- a-g & CTE course sequence/cluster completion rates
- 'On-time' progress of ELs toward English proficiency
- EL reclassification rate
- Advanced Placement scores of 3 or higher
- EAP results
- API

Other Student Outcomes

- Other indicators of student performance in required areas of study.

C. Engagement:

Parent Involvement

- Efforts to seek parent input for decisions at district and school site
- Promotion of participation from parents representing unduplicated pupil groups and Individuals with Exceptional Needs

Student Engagement

Rate of:

- School attendance
- Chronic absenteeism
- Middle School dropout
- High School dropout
- High School graduation

School Climate

- Student suspension rates
- Student expulsion rates
- Other local measures used to ascertain safety and school connectedness

*County Offices of Education have two additional priorities in the *Conditions for Learning* category:
9. Coordination of services for expelled students; 10. Coordination of services for foster youth.

Summary

In summary, under the requirements for LCAP, school districts are required to:

- ◆ Adopt LCAPs that include annual goals for all pupils, incorporate state priorities, and are updated each year.
- ◆ Present LCAP to the parent advisory committee and English Learner parent advisory for review, and provide the public an opportunity to comment on the plan.
- ◆ Use the template adopted by SBE to develop the school district's LCAP and post it on the school district's Internet Web site.
- ◆ File the LCAP with the County Superintendent of Schools for review and approval.
